

Region Director's Duties

- I. Board of Director's Meetings
 - a. Region directors will attend the summer convention and fully participate in all NHSACA Board of Director's meetings. This includes, but is not limited to,
 - i. Participating in discussions
 - ii. Making, and/or, seconding motions
 - iii. Voting on all actionable items brought to the board
 - b. Committees
 - i. Serve and participate on one "A" Committee as assigned by the President
 - ii. Serve and participate on one "B" Committee as assigned by the President
 - iii. Serve on any "Ad Hoc" committee as assigned by the President
 - iv. Serve as a replacement for any sport chair not in attendance
- II. Social Functions
 - a. Attend NHSACA Board of Director's Social and Dinner during the Annual Convention
 - b. Attend the NHSACA Board of Director's/COTY Social
 - c. Attend the Hall of Fame Induction Luncheon
 - d. Attend the Coach of the Year Awards Banquet
 - e. Attend other official NHSACA Board Socials during the Convention
- III. Duties to be performed from July –May
 - a. Recruit new member-states from the region you represent (You will coordinate this through Rich Montgomery, the Region Director Coordinator and Darin Boysen the State Executive Director's Representative to the NHSACA-Contact them prior to sending information or reaching out to any state)
 - i. Contact, by email, all state executive directors of states in your region
 - ii. Follow-up email contact with phone contact with all state executive directors...
 - iii. If applicable, contact all directors/presidents of sport specific coaches associations in the states in your region using email followed by phone calls. These contacts should do the following things:
 - 1. An invitation for their association to join NHSACA
 - 2. Information concerning NHSACA's mission (Recognize, Support, Educate coaches in the United States)
 - 3. Information concerning education opportunities during each national convention
 - 4. Information concerning the Hall of Fame Induction Luncheon and the Coach of the Year Awards Banquet
 - 5. A review of any coaches from their states that have been honored by NHSACA in the past
 - 6. Recognizing their association's work in their state for high school athletics and the amazing coaches they have in their state



- b. Recognition of coaches in your region that advance as finalist in the Coach of the Year process or have been selected for induction into the NHSACA Hall of Fame
 - i. You may send an email, make a phone call, or send a regular letter to do this.
 - 1. Congratulate the coach on this honor
 - 2. Encourage coach to attend the NHSACA national convention
 - 3. Offer assistance to the coach
